VISA REQUIREMENT

Citizens of the following countries can enter Taiwan visa-free for a specified number of days:

- Bangladesh- EVisa required
- Brunei Visa exemption with a duration stay up to 14 days
- Cambodia- E Visa required
- Indonesia- E Visa required
- Laos- EVisa required
- Malaysia- Visa exemption with a duration stay up to 30 days
- Myanmar- EVisa required
- Pakistan EVisa required
- Philippines- Visa exemption with a duration stay up to 14 days
- Singapore-Visa exemption with a duration stay up to 30 days
- Sri Lanka- EVisa required
- Thailand Visa exemption with a duration of 14 days
- Timor Leste EVisa required
- Vietnam EVisa required

NOTE:

- Passport must have at least 6 months remaining validity from the date of entry. Must have no criminal record in Taiwan
- *Please also check with your Tourism department or department of Foreign Affairs regarding Visa Requirement if visiting Taiwan from your Country.

Should you need a letter of Invitation, our office can issue one for you.

CURRENCY EXCHANGE

The stores and all business transactions in Taiwan only accepts New Taiwan Dollar (NT\$). It is advised that you change currency from any denomination to New Taiwan Dollar just before you exit from the airport. There are Currency exchange booths in the arrival area. Make sure that the Dollar note that you have is not crumpled or have some blemish.

- 1. Please have your names listed in the master list of your Union through the Health Ministries Director.
- 2. Please submit filled-up registration form to your Union Health Director.
- 3. For registration transactions you can pay through your Union.

NOTE:

- Early Bird promo registration ends on May 30, 2019
- Registration is first come, first serve limited to (300 pax only).
- Last day of registration is on August 15, 2019.

- The fee is \$16 dollars per person inclusive are transportation and food. Entrance fee to tourist spots are at own expense. (Note: Entrance fee is at minimal cost).

AIRPORTTRANSFER
